**GALLO CENTER 10-11 SEASON
SINGLE TICKETS ON SALE MONDAY, JUNE 21**

MODESTO, CA—June 20, 2010—Tickets for all individual performances during the 2010/2011 season at the Gallo Center for the Arts go on sale to the public at 10 a.m. on Monday, June 21. The season lineup features an array of entertainment attractions geared to a wide range of interests and tastes.

Tickets may be purchased online at galloarts.org, by calling 209-338-2100, or in person at the Center's ticket office, 1000 I Street in downtown Modesto. Ticket office hours are Monday through Friday from 10 am to 6 pm and on Saturdays from 10 am to 4 pm.

Among the highlights of the season are official Broadway touring productions of "Disney's Beauty and the Beast," "Spamalot," "Burn the Floor," "A Chorus Line" and "Fiddler on the Roof;" legendary rock group The Doobie Brothers; soul singer Michael Bolton; comedians Rob Schneider, Paul Rodriguez, and Colin Mochrie & Brad Sherwood; one of the longest running one-man shows in Broadway history, Steve Solomon's "My Mother's Italian, My Father's Jewish and I'm in Therapy;" country stars including Randy Travis and Lee Greenwood; and a deep array of family and children's programs such as the Vienna Choir Boys, The Flying Karamazov Brothers, the returning "It's Magic!," and the Golden Dragon Acrobats of China.

The Center has also announced additional shows since the initial release of its season line-up for subscription sales, among them Christian music superstar Steven Curtis Chapman in April 2011, and "Valley's Got Talent," a September 3 – 4 community talent show co-presented by the Center and The Modesto Bee.

New at the Center this season is a speaker series including author and sports columnist Mitch Albom (“Have a Little Faith”); educator and author Greg Mortenson (“Three Cups of Tea”); Modesto Bee advice columnist and author Amy Dickinson (“The Mighty Queens of Freeville”), and celebrity chef and television personality Anthony Bourdain (Travel Channel’s “No Reservations”).

In addition to buying tickets for single events, theatergoers have the option of purchasing from a choice of pre-packaged subscription series, or they may create a series of their own with a minimum purchase of four performances. Series subscribers receive priority seating while saving 15% as compared to single ticket buyers. Groups of 15 or more can also save 15% through the Center’s group sales program.
